Visual FoxPro Toolkit for .NET

The Visual FoxPro Toolkit for .NET is a class library with over 225 Visual FoxPro 7.0 functions for use with any .NET language. The included VFPToolkitNET.DLL is a .NET managed code DLL (not a COM wrapper) and does not require Visual FoxPro. The functions supported execute extremely fast since they are all written in .NET and compiled into a managed code .NET DLL. Included is a reference and tutorial stand-alone CHM help file as well as Visual Studio .NET integrated dynamic help using the same CHM help file. Full IntelliSense and Dynamic Help is enabled for the VFP functions when

LA Fox seeking Non-Profit Status.

The LA Fox Steering Committee has been considering Non-Profit organization for several years now for the main purposes of (1) limiting liability of the board and its members and (2) gaining more flexibility with general operations. From an operational standpoint, our group now has a Tax ID which can be used for banking/ financial transactions. In addition, as a Non-Profit Organization, the group can register with organizations like "Gifts in Kind" which will enable donors/sponsors to the group to receive tax benefits for helping our group which gives us more options.

In January of this year, LA FoxPro User Group, Inc. filed with the State of California as a Non-Profit Organization. The Corporation held its first "official" meeting of the board of directors in March where it named its directors, elected officers, and laid out its plans for seeking tax exemption as a non-profit educational entity. Your officers are: President – Bill Anderson, Vice President – Michael Cummings, Treasurer – Twila Miller, Secretary – Art Villa, and Asst. Secretary – Bob Risinger. Directors include Jon Melvin and Robin Connelly in addition to the officers named above. Art Villa is currently heading up the efforts for the non-profit tax-exempt status. These applications for tax exemption will be submitted to the Internal Revenue Service and to the State of California this month.

LA Fox C# SIG/Study Group Attracts Interest.

The new C# SIG of LA Fox meets on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays of each month. Jon Melvin of Vision Implementers, Inc. kicked off the 1st session on April 23rd by speaking on the similarities and differences between VFP and C#. programming in any .NET language. Using the VFP Toolkit or .NET, most Visual FoxPro 7.0 functions become available in Visual Basic .NET or any other .NET language. Functions like STRTOFILE() convert a string to a file in ! only one line of

The Visual FoxPro Toolkit for .NET does not teach developers Visual Studio .NET programming, but it does enable developers to do .NET programming much quicker and write less code based on what they are familiar with combined with how these functions reduce coding overall. It is not pseudo-VFP syntax, it is "real" VFP syntax and works most naturally in Visual Basic .NET since it no namespacing is required. The .NET Framework and Visual Basic .NET (or any .NET language) must still be learned. What this toolkit does is assist Visual FoxPro developers using .NET since there is a much quicker learning curve for .NET programming having these functions available. The Visual FoxPro Toolkit for .NET is not a replacement to any .NET language. It compliments and enhances the experience and productivity of .NET language programming.

Meeting Details

LA Fox meets on the second Tuesday of each month at NCR, 100 N. Sepulveda Blvd., El Segundo, CA. Meeting time is 7:30 PM. "Jumpstart" begins at 7:00 PM.

The building is on the NE corner of Sepulveda Blvd. and El Segundo Blvd. Enter parking on the West side of the building complex. There are 3 tall buildings there, with one parking entrance for all in the middle of the block. You need to be going North on Sepulveda to enter the parking structure, so for those of you coming from the 405 freeway, the El Segundo exit would work well. Take a ticket when you enter the parking structure. The gates will be opened after 8:00pm so you won't need to pay for parking unless you leave **really** early. The front doors to the building **do** get locked in the evenings.

Bldg.#1 - Upon entering the parking garage, make an immediate right and go all the way to the end (until you see the bank of elevators for Bldg.#1). Park your car and take the elevator to the main plaza level. From the main plaza, look for the walkway that goes to Bldg.#1 (The door is on the northeast side of the building.). Follow the walkway into the building, continue straight down the hallway until you reach a guard station on the left. By that guard station (which was a folding table the last time I was there) there are several elevators. Take one of these elevators to the 12th floor, sign in at the NCR guard station and they will use their badge to let you get on the elevator to the 14th floor. Look for signs when you get off the elevator on the 14th floor to direct you to the conference room.
